Minimum Wage Increase - What You Need to Know

- The minimum wage will be raising by 20 cents on October 1st, 2017
- Changes to the minimum wage are announced by April 1 of each year, and take effect on October 1.
- We have a total of five minimum wage rates in Ontario. Rates that apply to liquor servers, students under 18, hunting and fishing guides, and homeworkers will also increase at the same time.
- Most employees are eligible for minimum wage, whether they are full-time, part-time, casual employees, or are paid an hourly rate, commission, piece rate, flat rate or salary.
- Some employees have jobs that are exempt from the minimum wage provisions of the Employment Standards Act.
- An increase to \$11.60/hour will still keep full-time minimum wage earners 17% below the poverty line.
- Two-thirds of Canadians now support a \$15 minimum wage.
