RIGHT OF THE MONTH: DUITTING YOUR JOB

Employees are not required to give notice to their employer when quitting their job under the ESA, with two exceptions:

pregnancy / parental leave when the employee will not be returning to work; or

the employee quits while the employer is terminating 50 or more employees in a four week period.
 Nevertheless, employees might still be required to give notice under different laws. This refers to normal and voluntary resignation only and not situations involving constructive dismissal, breach of contract, etc.

CIVIC HOLIDAY—AUGUST 7

The Civic Holiday is a federal holiday celebrated on the first Monday of August. It is not a statutory holiday so only federal employers are required to give this day off.
