The Fight for \$15 & Fairness promotes full-time permanent work with enough hours for employees to live on. It is also calling for part-time employees to be paid the same as full-time ones doing the same job, fair scheduling and no exemptions from paid overtime.

\$15 Eurness

Ontario is lagging behind most other provinces and territories in two key areas, says

Beaulieu. For instance, Ontario is the only province in which employers can pay students
a minimum wage that, at \$10.30, is 70 cents below the general minimum wage. And workers in Ontario and the Yukon get only two weeks' paid vacation time a year while those in other provinces and territories get three."

Vacation and Vacation Pay

After 1 year working for the same employer, the average full-time employee is entitled to take 2 weeks of paid vacation.

This may work out to be less if you are part-time. Your boss has the right to decide when you can take your vacation, but cannot force you to take it in less than one week increments.

If you don't take your paid vacation, then you are entitled to 4% of your gross wages as vacation pay. If you leave a job without taking vacation, be sure to collect any wages owing.
