Right of the Month: Equal Pay for Equal Work

There are two pieces of legislation in Ontario which give everyone the right to equal pay for equal work; the Pay Equity Act and the Employment Standards Act (ESA).

The ESA requires that men and women be paid equally for work that is substantially the same, requires the same amount of skill, effort, and responsibility, and is performed in the same establishment under similar working conditions.
