BIG CHANGES happening this month!

SH (WEAR)

In 2014 many individuals and organizations were successful in getting the government to index the minimum wage to the rate of inflation, which means the Ontario minimum wage is increasing by 25 cents on **October 1st, 2015.** The following table shows the changes to each wage in our province. It is

important to note that even if the inflation rate decreases the minimum wage will **NOT** decrease along with it. Also, the student wage can only be paid to individuals 18 years or younger who do not work more than 28 hours on average per work week. If you are 18 years or younger and working more than 28 hours per week then you are entitled to the General Minimum Wage instead.

Right of the Month: Signing a Contract

You cannot sign away your rights! If you sign a contract that is illegal, your boss is breaking the law, not you. Even if you sign, you are still entitled to your rights under the law. Any contract you sign has to be equal to or better than the rules outlined in the Employment Standards Act.
