Right of the Month

Full-time students working in jobs listed below and attending a primary or secondary school, or a post-secondary educational institution (except when on holiday) are exempt from holiday pay, public holidays, and overtime. These exemptions are regardless of their age, whether they work more than 28 hours per week, or work at times other than school holidays.

These jobs include:

- employed in a recreational program operated by a charitable organization registered under the federal Income Tax Act if their work or duties are directly connected with the program;
- employed at a camp for children; or
- employed to instruct or supervise children.


