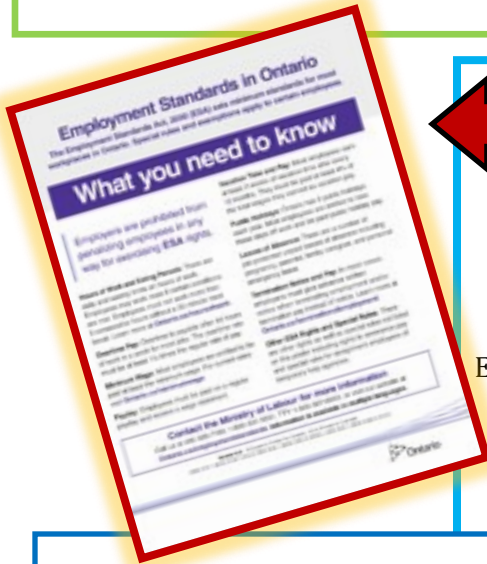

Employment Standards Poster

To help ensure that employers understand their obligations and that employees know their rights, the Minister of Labour has prepared and published an Employment Standards Poster entitled "Employment Standards in Ontario".

This poster describes important rights and requirements under the Employment Standards Act and **must** be posted in the workplace in a location where employees are likely to see it.

As of May 20th, 2015, employers are also required to give every new employee a copy of the poster within 30 days of hire.

The poster is available in 23 languages.

Changing Workplaces Review Summer 2015

The Ontario government will be reviewing the Employment Standards and Labour Relation Acts this coming summer. Two government appointed legal representatives will be in Sudbury on **July 23rd, 2015** for a public consultation (location TBA).

Workers across the province are organizing to send a clear message to the government that our labour laws have not kept up with changing employment relationships and have been weakened by exemptions, loopholes, and inadequate enforcement. This has left too many workers unprotected.
